Please find a description of what is considered a dwelling and what is other residential:

**Dwelling:** House, bungalow, Purpose Built or converted flat/maisonette, home of multi occupancy (HMO), self contained sheltered housing, caravan/mobile home/houseboat of permanent dwelling, and tenement building.

**Other Residential:** Hotel/motel, boarding house/B&B/ other B&B for homeless or asylum seekers, youth hostel, caravan site (in caravan/camper), other holiday residence such as cottage/flat/chalet, hostel for homeless, sheltered housing (not self-contained), residential home (children's/nursing/care/retirement), student halls of residence, boarding school accommodation, nurses'/doctors' accommodation, military/barracks. monastery/convent, and any other type of residential home.
