

Your fire and rescue service

Avon Fire & Rescue Service (AF&RS) protects the communities of Bath & North East Somerset, Bristol, North Somerset and South Gloucestershire.



This service costs the average Band D household $\pounds 67.93$ a year – or around $\pounds 1.31$ a week.

This year we have increased the precept, or the amount we ask for from the average home, by a total of £1.33 or less than 3p per week. Despite this rise, Avon Fire & Rescue Service's precept remains among the lowest in the country.

We also receive around a third of our funding from central Government. The grant we receive has fallen in recent years and will continue to reduce. As a result, savings of £5 million will need to be made over the next four years which means we will continue to implement plans to allow us to provide a first-class emergency service with a smaller budget.

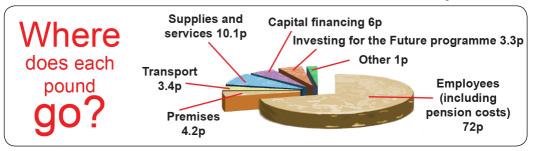
To reduce our running costs we have closed Speedwell Fire Station, with cover now being provided from an extended station at Kingswood.

This year we will also open a new fire station at Hicks Gate which will take over the cover previously provided by Brislington and Keynsham fire stations.

Our Headquarters function is also due to move from the centre of Bristol and consideration is being given to relocating to the Avon and Somerset Constabulary Headquarters at Portishead.

Although we are making changes to the way we deliver our services, ensuring the safety of local people remains our focus.

Annual budget

Avon Fire Authority has set its net budget for 2016/17 at £42.794 million (m). This represents a Council Tax level of £67.93 a year for a Band D property, an increase of just below 2%.

The Government's funding assessment for Avon Fire Authority has been reduced to $\pounds 18.629m$ for 2016/17, a reduction of $\pounds 1.443m$ (7.14%). The impact of this is that the funding provided by Central Government has been reduced by $\pounds 1.471m$ (9.54%), to $\pounds 13.949m$.
